Feb: 2: 1735, We resigned up our Sister Anne Wilkins by a letter of recommendation to Saint: Doves Church in London.

May: 16: 1736, We cut of from the Church Ann Harman for going away from us & from Town in a sudden, abrupt manner, being strongly suspected by many people to be a breeding; whereby great reproach & objections was bro: on us, & on way of God; & after her departure, she never sent us to let us know where she was, but when providentially we heard she was at London, & sent to her, & saying her to come down, & clear her self from this foul charge, & give us satisfaction in this matter; she never took notice of our message, nor came to us with her desire, altho we proposed to pay of expenses of her journey, & we labored upon, to be a great contempt of us &c

May: 16: 1736, We cut of from Church Sarah Bannister for casting great slight & contempt on us, by reproaching & vilifying us in & about the matter of her Sister Ann Harman, saying we were their enemies & worshippers of Wood: & on; that her had been persecuted by us ever since she came amongst us, & that she had not come any more among us (if her co: help it) neither had her husband come, & she persecuted him as much as she could to absent from us; & altho she had been sent to, several times, & admonished & reproved, yet she never regarded us, nor ever came to give us satisfaction

May: 16: 1736, We withdrew our Communion from Thos: Bannister for 7: following Reasons, 1st for being seen in Bed with his Sister in Law, attested by 2 of our Members to whom his wife told it in much horror: 2^d for being grown loose in his Conversation, & altho he acknowledged, yet fell into it again: 3^d for being suspected & charged with leading unlawfull familiarly with his Sister; he never took proper measures to clear himself, nor satisfy us in this matter, but grew cold & indifferent in Religion & come but seldom to attend on of Word, & so seem'd to turn his back on his Profession.

We reced a letter from Mr: Brand of London abt: Nath: Bannister's desiring to have Communion with Cripplegate Church - dated June 18: 1736, to which we wrote on the 21st of Aug: 1737 to effect: that he was here baptized & reced a Member in full Communion, & 4: abt: 16 Months ago he went from us to London we are ignorant of his Conversation & Behaviour there, & 4: when we wrote to him desiring to know where he attended on of Word & how he could be safe in of Omission of Gospel Institutions, he never gave us any satisfactory answer, & so was all we do say in of Case at present.

Oct: 11: 1737 We resigned up Mr: 10th in Tullors by a letter of recommendation to Fairfeld Church.

Nov: 10: 1737 - Anne Bannister, or Sister Anne Webb: died at Hampton & was buried in Shortwood Meet: house the 10th

Dec: 1: 1737 - Our Bro: Mr: Freeman who was our faithful Minister & pastor for abt: 20 years, - died in 74 year of his age

July 30: 1738 We wrote a letter to Thos: Bannister informing him of having waited long for some proofs of his sorrow & some of his duty, & finding none, we were resolved to take rule of of people sent him from of Church, & next Communion Day: for of Christ as mentioned above & we added some more viz: The manner of his going from of Town to London, his strange conduct, & having 2 Wives
